

NOTICE ON THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE FOURTH MULTI YEAR PRICE DETERMINATION (MYPD4) REGULATORY CLEARING ACCOUNT (RCA) APPLICATION FOR 2020/21 FINANCIAL YEAR

The National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA) is a regulatory authority established as a juristic person in terms of Section 3 of the National Energy Regulator Act, 2004 (Act No. 40 of 2004). NERSA's mandate is to regulate the electricity, piped-gas and petroleum pipelines industries in terms of the Electricity Regulation Act, 2006 (Act No. 4 of 2006), Gas Act, 2001 (Act No. 48 of 2001) and Petroleum Pipelines Act, 2003 (Act No. 60 of 2003).

Eskom submitted its MYPD4 Year 2 RCA application on 19 November 2021 and in this application Eskom is requesting to be allowed an amount of R10 720bn for the financial years 2020/21.

On 15 February 2022, the Energy Regulator published a consultation paper together with Eskom's RCA application.
